Services

- ◆ All of our services and facilities are free, except for printing. Users from our member departments have the highest priority for use. Our Member departments are: Anthropology, Communications, Economics, Education Geography, Jackson School of International Studies, Political Science, Psychology, Public Affairs, Social Work, Sociology.
- ◆ CSSCR provides a consulting service to help clients use the hardware and software supported by the Center. We support over 100 classes and 6,000 students each year.
- ◆ We have a large Archive of Electronic Data. Most of our data is from the Inter-university Consortium for Political and Social Research at the University of Michigan (ICPSR). Locally we have 800+ data sets and through ICPSR we have access to thousands more. We are also a member of the Washington State Data Center and have many U.S. government data collections. We have a subscription to Datastream, an international commercial service that supplies thousands of economic time series data sets, many of which are international data.
- ◆ We have a growing collection of data available on CD-ROM.
- ◆ We will instruct your classes on computer-related topics. Popular sessions include introductions to statistics packages, the Internet and operating systems.
- ◆ CSSCR publishes a quarterly Newsletter announcing our free non-credit courses and news from the Center.

Facilities

- ◆ Faculty/Graduate Research room. This room has three Dell machines and a secure, quiet environment in which to perform research. Access to the room is granted to individuals with projects which require this more studious atmosphere. The computers contain research software like Gauss, Stata and S-plus. - ◆ Room 135 Savery has 40 Dell machines. These computers are running the Windows 2000 operating system, and a have a great deal of software available.
- ◆ Room 137 has 20 Dell machines, similar to Room 135. This second lab is also used for instruction and homework.
- ◆ Our classroom has a Dell computer and a Macintosh computer for the lecturer to use in conjunction with an LCD projector.
- ◆ Our high quality projectors in both Labs and our classroom allow us to accommodate three classes at the same time.
- ◆ Our drop-in Lab has ten Dell computers and four Macintoshes. The peripherals include: dvd burners, flatbed and slide scanners. Software such as InDesign, Photoshop, IMovie and Premiere will aid in creating Web pages, illustrations, and Art.
